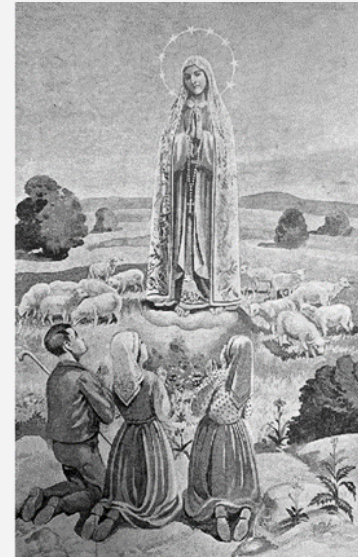

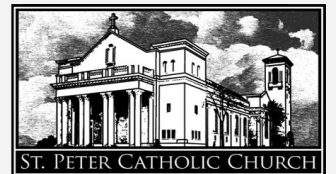

ST. PETER CATHOLIC CHURCH

This is an ongoing summary of *Veritatis splendor*, an encyclical by Pope St. John Paul II 30 years ago. This was the first magisterial encyclical devoted entirely to issues regarding a fundamental understanding of the Church's teaching on moral theology. It is a magisterial document of the highest importance and relevance then, today, and ages to come.

Chapter Three – Moral good for the life of the Church and of the world – Morality and new evangelization (paragraph 106-108)

The evangelization of the world is the greatest challenge the Church faces and has been so since the beginning. The challenge is not due first to the culture in which we live; the challenge to evangelize comes directly from the mandate of Christ who defines the reason for the Church's existence when he commanded: "Go into the whole world and preach the Gospel to every creature."

Our present age is filled with difficult challenges to evangelize. Even peoples once rich in the Faith have been de-Christianized. This involves not only the loss of faith, but also, of course, an obscuring of the moral sense. There is a widespread tendency toward subjectivism,

utilitarianism, and relativism. These have claimed full cultural and social legitimacy. This is why as the Church evangelizes, she must also proclaim and present morality. Just as the Church must proclaim Christ and the truths of the Faith, she must also present the foundations of Christian morality. This shows the authenticity of her evangelization and leads people to the word proclaimed – and the word lived.

A life of holiness which many of the People of God live shows the simplest way to find the beauty of truth, the liberation God's love brings, and the value of unconditionally following God's Law even in difficult situations. We can see this truth above in all in the Saints and the Virgin Mother of God.

Evangelization is only possible with the Holy Spirit. When the Holy Spirit is received by the humble and docile heart of the believer, this brings about the flourishing of the moral life. The continued theological reflection about the moral life is at the heart of the Church and is the work of the Holy Spirit. Once that is understood, then the mission and responsibility of moral theologians is properly understood.
